



POWELL LIBRARY, 1929 – 2021

Built in 1929, Powell Library is one of the four original buildings on UCLA’s campus.

Just like the medieval manuscripts and scientific journals found within the walls of the **Powell Library**, the foundation of this world-class brick structure was designed to handle the *test of time* (including a few earthquakes!) The artistry and craftsmanship of the tile and brick work was based on an Italian (Lombard) Romanesque Revival style and has become a historic landmark in the community.
